Project GreenHands

No green cover means no water, no oxygen... NO LIFE! The diminishing tree cover on our planet is putting our very survival in question.

PROJECT GREENHANDS - Mass Tree Planting through people's participation is the immediate need.

Current Scenario

Over-exploitation of natural resources has led to massive degradation of ecological systems and to global warming. Unless serious corrective measures like restoration of tree cover, ground water and soil health are put in place, our way of life will be seriously affected.

The situation in the state of Tamil Nadu. India is a case in point. The forest or tree cover in Tamil Nadu is only 17.58%, against the national ideal of 33%. Tamil Nadu receives heavy rains for a short period from October to December, resulting in heavy floods and soil erosion, where almost 50% of rainfall runs off to the sea, carrying life sustaining soil with it. In the absence of green cover, a severe drinking water scarcity has also arisen. An increasing population in the next 35 – 50 years will lead to prime agricultural lands being lost to fulfill the basic needs of the people. Due to uncertainty in the monsoons and adverse climate changes, food production will become a matter of chance.

With the current rate of land degradation, experts predict that by 2025, 60% of Tamil Nadu will be a desert, unsuitable for food production. This situation, if unchecked, will result in loss of ecological balance, poverty and social instability.

What is Project GreenHands?

Project GreenHands is an ecological initiative of Isha Foundation to prevent and reverse environmental degradation and enable sustainable living. The Project aims to create 10% additional green cover in Tamil Nadu. Drawing on large scale people's participation, Project GreenHands intends to plant 114 million trees. Additionally, nature awareness campaigns are conducted to establish a culture of care for the environment. Starting from Tamil Nadu, Project GreenHands seeks to inspire people around the world to keep this planet livable for future generations.



Why Plant Trees?

Trees

- Reduce global warming and adverse climate change by absorbing carbon dioxide and releasing oxygen to the atmosphere.
- Are essential for seeding the clouds, rain harvesting, groundwater recharge and to maintain a healthy hydrologic cycle.
- Are an effective means of soil regeneration and prevention of soil erosion.
- Provide home and habitat to different species of plants and animals, enhancing bio-diversity.
- Mitigate poverty and malnutrition by serving as a source of income generation and nutritious food.

Awareness is the Key

A shift in mindset is crucial to preserve the natural environment for future generations. This needs to happen by

- Cultivating a culture of revering trees as the very basis of life.
- Creating awareness about using natural systems for a sustainable livelihood.



Project Green Hands - Results

2005	25,000 seedlings planted in Tsunami affected villages of Cuddalore District.
2006	Guinness World Record – 852,587 seedlings planted on a single day in 6,284 locations of 27 districts in Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry, involving 256,289 people.
2007	Over 4 million saplings were grown in 427 Isha nurseries and 44 partners' nurseries and planted in the state of Tamil Nadu.

Goals

- 1. To plant 114 million saplings in Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry. 85% of the trees will be planted in villages and 15% in schools and colleges in towns and cities.
- 2. To establish 4 large-scale nurseries, able to produce 1 million saplings of income-generating trees each.
- 3. To establish Mobile Environmental Awareness Centres that tour from village to village to inspire a change in mindset of the population.
- To establish "Green Villages" a sustainable tree planting model in which intensive plantation zones with up to 33% green cover are implemented and maintained directly by the village inhabitants.
